Wishing you all a happy Easter filled with joy, laughter, and cherished moments with loved ones.




THE BRAMFIELD CAFÉ








BRAMFIELD HOUSE OF HORRORS

MINDFULNESS



We're delighted to share with you an update on our new mindfulness sessions for boys to opt-in to as part of their YOLO programme. These sessions have been met with enthusiasm and engagement from our boys, who have tried various mindfulness techniques alongside craft activities to calm the mind. Mindfulness is the practice of being fully present and aware of our thoughts, feelings, body, and the surrounding environment. Mindfulness can help to cultivate a greater sense of calm, focus, and resilience. During our sessions, the boys have explored a plethora of mindfulness approaches, ranging from guided meditation and deep breathing exercises to mindful craft activities like mindful eating, creating tealight holders and physical grounding techniques.

One of the highlights has been the boys' willingness to experiment with these different mindfulness practices and share some of their experiences with one another. From discussing the benefits of mindfulness on anxieties and mental well-being to listening and engaging during meditation, the boys have fostered a supportive and inclusive environment for personal growth and reflection.

ECO NEWS

This term has seen the school gain The Green Mark Level 1 certification. We have shown what steps we have taken to reduce our impact on the environment and improve sustainability so far. An action plan has been developed outlining what further opportunities we have in order to improve. 35 tasks were undertaken covering the areas of Policy and Organisation, Benchmark and Targets, Communication and Review, Local Environment, Utilities and Waste.

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The school have received 8 swift nest boxes and a call system from Save Our Suffolk Swifts. The boxes will be decorated, and the nest provided with grass and feathers. They will then be attached to the front of the main house and the swift call played in order to attract swifts to set up a nesting colony. Swifts pair for life, returning to the same site each year for a little nest renovation before laying and incubating their eggs. They like to live in houses and churches, squeezing through tiny gaps to nest inside roofs. But as more old buildings are renovated and gaps in soffits closed up, Swift nest sites are fast disappearing. This, in part, resulted in Swifts being added to the red list in the 2021 UK Conservation Status Report. Red is the highest conservation priority, with species on this list needing urgent action.





Activities that we have taken part in this term have been the RSPB's Big Schools' Birdwatch, The Big Plastic Count and The Great Big School Clean. So boys have been busy birdwatching, counting plastic used over a week, producing the schools plastic footprint and trying to fill as many bin bags as possible with a bit of healthy competition between lower school classes.



Signs have also been installed to encourage drivers to turn off their engines whilst waiting. It will improve air quality around school and also save fuel use.



Other activities have seen a stumpery made in the wooded area. Stumperies use tree stumps and wood to make a wildlife friendly garden. We have also continued our litter picking in the local community.





SKI TRIP 2024



This year's ski trip to Pila, Italy was different from previous years with Bramfield joining three others schools from within the Outcome First Group. We set off from Cambridge on a coach that travelled to Dover, then on the ferry. Once in France we drove through the night and arrived in Pila at 11.30 am. The days consisted of leaving the hotel at 8am and taking a short drive on the coach to Aosta, the boys then collected their ski equipment and headed up the mountain on the main Pila Gondola. Once in resort the boys were split into two separate ski groups, with each having an Interski instructor. Morning lessons were from 9.30am to 11.30am then a stop in a local restaurant for lunch before heading out for the afternoon lessons. All of the boys that attended gave their all during the lessons, listening to the instructors and we could see the how the boys were progressing on a daily basis with some even moving up into an intermediate group. Evenings consisted of activities that included a trip to a local pizzeria, a town visit to Aosta with some authentic Italian ice cream to finish the day off.

I cannot put into words how proud I am of the pupils who attended this year. We witnessed, kindness, determination and willingness to succeed. The pupils integrated well with the other school pupils and staff members and comments were made to me about how polite the boys were throughout the stay. A once in a lifetime experience for some, with the majority already asking me if they can attend on the next trip planned for next year. Parents/Carers should be proud of their child's achievements during a week away from home. They endured a long coach journey to Italy but managed the whole experience extremely well, they represented Bramfield house school in a positive way. Here's to the next one in 2025!
