City College Norwich Mainstream college offering a wide variety of course subjects and pathways from entry level – degree. Has a specialist SEND team.	
College of West Anglia Mainstream college offering a wide variety of courses and pathways. Has a specialist SEND team. College is split across 4 different campuses, ensure you check which campus each course is based at.	
Easton College Mainstream college specialising primarily in land based, outdoor and sport related courses – also offers public services.	
Access Creative College Norwich Creative college offering courses relating to music, media, games design and computing.	
Dereham, Norfolk - Sense - Specialist college 16-25, individually tailored curriculum based around vocational studies, life skills and independence. Therapeutic support available. - Day services for adults who are deafblind, have multi-sensory impairment or have complex disabilities.	
Calman Colaiste College - Specialist college 16-25 offering vocational (qualification routes available at the relevant level), life skills and work-related learning. - Offers Duke of Edinburgh award. - High ratio of staff to students. - Residential and supported living options also available.	
St Elizabeth's College - Specialist college 19-25 offering a programme of development over a three-year period, which develops learners' independent living skills; provides work-related learning and work experience opportunities; and focuses on relevant English, mathematics and ICT skills (qualification routes available at the relevant level).	
Cambridge Regional College - Large mainstream college offering variety of pathways including apprenticeships and supported internships. Adult learning and higher education available. - 14-19 alternative provision options.	

- Courses in variety of different industries – offers scholarship courses with Cambridge united football.	
<u>Peterborough College</u> - Large but inclusive 16-19 college plus adult learning courses. - Specialist RAF and defence college pathway. - Variety of course subjects and types.	
<u>CAST - Cambridge Academy for Science and Technology</u> - 13-19 specialist science academy (life sciences, STEM, applied science) offering GCSE, A level and T level courses.	
<u>East Coast College</u> - College for 16+ including adult courses. - Lowestoft campus has a sixth form college – broader academic options. - Specialist maritime, energy and offshore training centres, combined with commercial training and a partnership with University of Suffolk, the college has become a centre of excellence for energy, engineering and offshore skills training. - Variety of other course subjects and types available.	
<u>Suffolk New College</u> - Spread over 4 campuses: Ipswich, Suffolk rural and on the coast in both Leiston / Halesworth - Football and education programmes in partnership with Ipswich town FC. - Variety of subject areas and pathways offered. - Inclusive learning programme.	
<u>Suffolk One Sixth Form College</u> - 16-19 college with a focus on A- levels but offers some vocational subjects at level 2 and above. - Has a 3 year inclusive learning pathway offering.	
<u>West Suffolk College</u> - Mainstream post 16 college, adult learning and university centre. - Inclusive learning pathways available - Range of course subjects and types. - Thrive programme – government funded skills and employment support service	
<u>Hillside Special School - Post 16</u> - Specialist school with sixth form provision up to 19 for young people with PMLD.	
<u>Riverwalk School</u> - 2 post 16 classes wo work towards AQA unit awards. - Students have a range of needs including ASD, PMLD and complex medical needs.	
<u>Sixth Form Churchill Park Academy</u> - Specialist school with provision to 19. - Residential options available. - Mainly cater for pml and challenging behaviour. - Utilise ASDAN personal progress qualifications	
<u>Warren School - Home</u> - Specialist school with provision to 19 for young people with SLD and PMLD.	
<u>Post 16 — Lapwing Education</u> - Alternative post 16 provider with 1:1, 2:1 and small group learning – high staff ratio. - Bespoke programme combining personal development with academic targets – qualifications available up to entry level 3. - Offers 3 separate post 16 SEMH groups in North, South and West Suffolk commissioned by SCC for those working above entry level 3.	

<u>New Skills Centre Education</u> - Provision for 11-16 and 16-19 year olds who have difficulty attending mainstream settings and larger buildings. - Bespoke curriculum devised with individual and parents. Carers at post 16 with optional subjects, maths and English embedded unless already achieved and work experience / life skills.	
<u>TCHC Group</u> - GAPS programme combines a vocational aim with maths and English, work experience and skills for life and work. Dunstable site is a specialist centre for SEND.	
<u>WS Training</u> - Smaller independent training provider - 4 pathways: personal progress, vocational and supported internship – all available to 25 and require EHCP. Next steps pathways is 16-19 no ehcp required.	
<u>Colchester Institute</u> - Mainstream post 16 college, adult learning and university centre. - Inclusive learning pathways available - Range of course subjects and types.	
<u>Lexden Springs School </u> - Specialist provision for children and young people aged 3-19 year old with PMLD, SLD and ASD. - Residential provision options	
<u>Chelmsford College</u> - Inspire programme catered for young people with SEND - Lots of vocational courses start at entry level 3. - Based on 2 campuses. - Steps2 programme is Chelmsford College's award-winning Business Innovation Initiative, designed to help local businesses meet their recruitment needs by fostering inclusive employment practices.
